





The online sessions include interactive presentations, forum discussions, and live lectures which are being taught and attended from five continents. At present, the online sessions include Module VII of MACS 2018 (4-22 May), as well as Module III of IMACC 2019 and Module III of MACS 2019 (both taking place from 18 May to 5 June).

In addition, IACA is offering further opportunities for capacity building in anti-corruption. On 30 April, the Academy launched its on-demand video lecture titled "Use of Anti-Corruption Compliance Standards and Guidelines for Designing and Implementing an Anti-Corruption Compliance Programme", which aims to support companies in the implementation of anti-corruption compliance programmes content and will be especially useful for small and medium-sized enterprises. One more session was delivered this Thursday and two more sessions will be delivered on Thursdays of each of the next two weeks. This will meet the needs of the anti-corruption community for efficient and effective learning.

Our small team at IACA also succeeded in developing our first online course, which has also been made available online. The course is titled "Insights into Cybercrime and Electronic Evidence: A Basic Introduction for Non-Technicians" and seeks to offer non-technical insights into some of the most interesting and important aspects of the way in which crime and criminal justice are responding to the Information Society. The course introduces the main theses, threats, challenges, and conundrums posed by this most modern trend of crime and explores the main solutions designed to address them. This course is comprised of 11 sessions with a final test and is offered on a non-commercial, non-profit basis.
